

MRI Assessment Program Final Report

This is the last in a series of reports on Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) Assessment Program since 1987. It brings together the results of the previous reports and contains the results of the controlled introduction of the first MRI units in the five participating Australian teaching hospitals.

It documents 17,000 scans performed on 14,500 patients using MRI in units of two 1.5 and one 1.0 T Superconductive; and two resistive 0.3 units. This includes a summary of the follow-up studies which were performed as a part of the MRI assessment program; a revised consensus statement outlining the clinical conditions which may indicate MRI scanning; and a summary of costs.
